REQUEST FOR ELECTRONIC DELIVERY OF NOTICES

Texas Property Tax Code Sec. 1.086. On the written request of the owner of a residential property that is occupied by the owner as the owner's principal residence, the Chief Appraiser of the Appraisal District in which the property is located shall send each notice required by this title related to (1) a change in value of the property; (2) the eligibility of the property for an exemption; or (3) the grant, denial, cancellation, or other change in the status of an exemption or exemption application applicable to the property to the e-mail address of the owner.

INSTRUCTIONS: To request electronic delivery of notices permitted to be delivered by the Chief Appraiser, complete this form and mail, email or deliver it to our office at the address provided above. **Please note, this request is specific to the property identified on this form and is not transferrable.**
